Welcome to Camp Boaz!!

We want to welcome you and your child to Camp Boaz! Camp Boaz is designed to address your child's social, physical, emotional and intellectual needs. Camp Boaz offers supplemental academic support, and enrichment activities. We believe that children possess a natural love of learning and that learning can truly be fun. Our primary concern is the well-being of your child. We want each child to experience daily activities where they will be challenged to explore the world, develop the power to think for themselves, and meet new situations with confidence. An appropriate childhood curriculum based on theory, research and experience of how children develop and learn will be implemented. A balanced approach will be used that offers a unique blend between camp and school activities. Camp Boaz will allow children to build skills and explore special interests at a relaxed "summer pace." By working together we can make the summer an experience your child will look forward to with enthusiasm!

Hours of Operation

7: 30 a.m. – 5:30 p.m. Monday – Friday

Admission Requirements:

- Students must reside in the Boaz City School District. Ages Pre-K thru Age 13 (\$ on or before September 1, 2009).
- A registration fee of **\$25.00 per family** is required along with a completed registration form
- Updated medical information must be on file.
- You **should not have any outstanding balance** due to Extended Day or any other Community Education Program.

Arrival and Departure

- For safety purposes, only those individuals listed on the child's registration form will be allowed to check out your child. In case of an emergency, you may call the lead teacher and make other arrangements.
- **Anyone** who is responsible for transporting a child must show **proper identification** to school staff.

Snack afternoon

A Seamless Summer Feeding program will be available for children and students through age 18 beginning June 9 at Boaz Elementary School. Breakfast, lunch, and an afternoon snack are free to those who would like to come. This program is offered by the Boaz City School Child Nutrition Program.

Discipline:

Camp Boaz will follow the same code of conduct established by the Boaz City Board of Education for the regular school year.

- Students are responsible for their actions. We encourage self-control in both speech and action.
- Students must observe safety rules of the school for their own security, as well as the security of others.
- Students are expected to follow rules developed within each classroom.
- In case of inappropriate behavior, staff will redirect students to appropriate behavior and activities or "time out" to calm down and reflect.
- Excessive behavioral problems that cannot be remedied through the above measures may result in suspension or dismissal from the program.

Illness and Medication

- Medication cannot be administered at Camp Boaz. This applies to sunscreen, Neosporin, etc. Sunscreen must be applied by the child or parent
- Make sure that all medical information is up to date on your child—this includes allergies and any health restrictions.
- If a child becomes ill or injured while at Camp Boaz, he or she will be isolated from other students with a care giver. You will be called to pick him or her up. Make sure there are numbers where you may be reached.
- If you have a change of job, telephone number, insurance information, etc., please notify the Camp Boaz office.
- If the child is on a field trip, the lead teachers will use their judgment to seek medical assistance, if necessary. You, as the parent or guardian, will be financially responsible for any and all medical fees incurred.
