How are parents involved in schools?

Parent/Teacher Conferences

Parents and teachers meet regularly to discuss student progress and to strengthen home/school partnerships.

Home/School Compacts

Parents, students, and schools jointly develop agreements and define goals, expectations, and shared responsibilities.

School-wide Parent Advisory Council (PAC) Meetings

Each Title I school has at least 4 meetings per year to provide information about the program, share strategies for academic success, and offer time for parents to ask questions and give feedback.

Title I Planning Committee

Each Title I school invites parents to join the planning process as they evaluate programs and plan for the coming school year.

How are parents involved at the system level?

System-level Parent Advisory Council

These parents participate in the development of the system's Title I Parent Involvement Plan and are valued partners in the program evaluation process.

Valuable information gained at these meetings is shared with parents and teachers at the school level.

This committee carefully reviews materials designed to enhance parental involvement in Title I schools and publishes a list of recommended parent involvement resources annually.

Collaboration

Federal Programs partners with the 21st Century Community Learning Center to provide excellent parent training. This strong alliance provides after school and summer school programs where teachers provide academic enrichment or intervention. Evenings are filled with family, community and parent training.

How can I be involved?

- Look at your child's performance and be sure to understand where your child stands in reading and mathematics.
- Talk with your child's teachers and principal to find out how you and your school can work together to improve your child's performance.
- Be aware of your school's performance under NCLB (No Child Left Behind). Communicate your school's successes to your community and look for ways to support your school.
