Teaching and Learning	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Teaching and learning will occur utilizing traditional methods; online methods will be practiced▪ Google Classroom will house student assignments	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Formative and Summative Computer-based Assessments via Schoology will be given.▪ Additional required federal/state/district assessments to be administered to students following federal/state/district guidelines.▪ Contact local schools regarding the need for Internet accessibility.▪ Online Student Management System will provide access to all curriculum.▪ Boaz City Virtual School application is due by Thursday, July 30, 2020.

Health and Safety Procedures

Cleanliness and Hygiene	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Enhanced cleaning and disinfecting of classrooms, restrooms, and common areas▪ Hand washing/hygiene routines/Hand Sanitizer Stations throughout schools▪ Facial coverings for employees will follow Governor Ivey’s Health Order (Item 13c).▪ Facial coverings for students are highly recommend as practical and feasible in the school.
Social Distancing	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Practice social distancing protocols including<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Line spacing, staggered and/or one-way class changes○ Modified classroom seating arrangements○ Face mask/covering required when 6 feet social distancing cannot be maintained○ Limited/no contact sports in PE, etc. and limited locker room usage○ BCSS will limit unnecessary congregations of students and staff
Transportation Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ All students/staff riding buses will wear face mask/covering for entire route▪ Assign students to seats; seat students with members of same household▪ Stagger bus loading and unloading following social distance guidelines▪ Sanitize school buses following morning and afternoon routes▪ Keep windows down on buses when appropriate to maximize air flow while in route
Child Nutrition Program Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Meals consumed in classrooms or in cafeteria with limited capacity▪ Students will be provided a simplified menu in which to choose meals▪ Students will be encouraged to pay for meals via online option
Parent/Family Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Parents/Guardian Conferences: In person or virtual▪ Check-in/out: One parent/guardian allowed inside; Visitor access will be extremely limited
Parent/Guardian Guidance	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Monitor child’s temperature every morning. Students with temperature of 100.4 or higher should stay at home and consider COVID-19 testing if there is no other explanation.▪ Monitor for the following COVID-19 symptoms every morning and keep student home if present: cough, congestion, shortness of breath, or gastrointestinal symptoms.▪ Teach and reinforce proper handwashing, coughing into elbow/tissue; not sharing personal items/supplies; self-reporting any symptoms to teacher/nurse▪ Notify local school immediately if the student is exposed to COVID-19, the student is tested for COVID-19, or a household member tests positive for COVID-19.
